## NSF Travel Awards for RECOMB 2012

Thanks to generous support from the National Science Foundation, we have some funds to support student travel for RECOMB 2012. We have roughly \$15,000 available in travel support to fund 20-30 attendees. These awards are only available to students in US institutions. Receipts will be required for all travel awards. Reimbursement will be made after the conference.

- 1. Name
- 2. Country of citizenship
- 3. Title of paper, if you are an author, and if you will be presenting it.
- 4. Title of poster, if you are a poster presenter
- 5. University name and country.
- 6. A paragraph describing your academic standing and interests, your expected graduation date and degree, advisor's name, and, if available, a URL for a working Web page. Also indicate whether and when you have attended previous major computational biology conference or not.
- 7. We encourage applications from members of underrepresented groups for these awards. (**Optional**) Please indicate if you are part of such a group or at an institution that is not typically represented at computer science conferences.
- 8. US dollar estimate of the airfare/transportation cost to the conference and the number of nights you will be staying.
- 9. Please have your advisor send a supporting paragraph confirming your student status, recommending your attendance, and describing the availability of travel funds. S/he should send an email to **fedele at princeton dot edu** with the subject line RECOMB 2012 travel application, along with your name.

The awards will be announced by March 1. You should receive an email acknowledging your application within 3 weekdays. If not, please resubmit.

Priority for Travel Awards will be based on the following:

- Student authors and co-authors of accepted papers who do not have other support.
- Members of under-represented groups or from institutions not traditionally represented at the conference who have research interests in areas covered by RECOMB whose attendance would broaden participation at the conference.
- Financial need.
